# The Jane Austen Project

(Rachel & Liam travel from a far advanced future, where light and food are artificially produced, into the restrictive world of 1815. Posing as a rich doctor and his sister, former slave owners from Jamaica, their object is to befriend Henry Austen, and through him, meet sister Jane and recover a suspected unpublished novel - 'The Watsons'. Romantic attachments complicate the project; history is being altered. Years of preparation to immerse themselves into the Regency world of manners, speech & customs are not enough to avoid suspicion. The portal is about to close; their escape & future is uncertain.
